Starting with our January 11th program, LBL lectures will be held in Room 407 of the Earl K Long Library at UNO.

The library is very easy to find – it is the central building on campus.

The new room will present us with a warmer, more intimate setting and a fantastic view of the lake.

PARKING: Parking is still free and readily available. Several lots offer easy access to the library.

NOTE: The lots we recommend below will be free for LBL guests. Other parking lots on campus are limited to registered vehicles.

University Center lot: this is the one you are familiar with from our prior sessions in the UC. A walk of about 325 steps to the library.

Homer Hitt Alumni Center lot: (The building with the tall smokestack on the lake edge of campus.) This lot is accessible from Lakeshore Drive and has many parking spots. It is a slightly shorter walk than from the UC lot. It is directly in front (North) of the library.

Performing Arts Center lot: This is between the library and Performing Arts Center. It is the closest to the library but has **limited space**. If you plan to use this lot, we advise that you come early in case you have to divert to one of the larger lots. It is accessible off Leon C Simon Blvd, enter the campus at the traffic light on St Anthony.

Bus and ramp access: An access road to the side of the library is available via Founders Road off of Leon C Simon. Buses and cars needing direct access to wheelchair ramp may offload there. Please be aware there is no parking there, pick-up and drop-off only.

We do hope that any inconvenience caused by our shift is minimal. Parking is still readily available, only learning a new endpoint is required. The new room and location, we feel, will offset any one time inconvenience. We look forward to seeing you at our coming sessions.
